ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND LANDS

Ministerial Order No. **M 259**

I, Mike Lambert, Associate Deputy Minister of Agriculture and Lands, exercising the authority delegated to me under section 2(2) of the *Forest and Range Practices Act*,

- a) am satisfied that the areas described in the Appendix to this Order
 - i) are visually important based on their physical characteristics and public use, and
 - ii) require special management that has not otherwise been provided for by the Government Actions Regulation, B.C. Reg. 582/2004, or another enactment, and

- b) hereby order that, effective December 22, 2005,
 - i) the areas currently existing as scenic areas for the Dawson Creek Timber Supply Area are abolished,
 - ii) the areas set out in the Appendix, are established as scenic areas for the Dawson Creek Timber Supply Area of the Peace Forest District pursuant to section 7(1) of the Government Actions Regulation,
 - iii) the Hambler Lakes Scenic area is deleted,
 - iv) scenic areas or portions of scenic areas that fall within TFL #48 are not included in this Order.
